1. ISP have been implemented in the country with varying degrees of success, including underperformance due to several factors
2. AIP is still needed but needs to be redesigned, considering a number of suggested interventions in short- medium and long-term that we could be looking at
3. Need to clearly define the options that are available, presenting scenarios on the redesign
4. Redesigning should be done without compromising on the AIP objective of food security, redesigning needs to look at policy objectives, costs of the program, targeting, AIP package, quality of the inputs, diversification of inputs, contribution levels, monitoring of the program, complementary programs (soil health to deal with yield response to N), among others
